
Who Should Attend

Travel Information

Ground Transportation to and from Orlando Airport.

Mears Transportation operates shuttle service to/from the resort and the Orlando Airport. Tickets may be purchased at the Mears desk on the baggage level of the airport and cost \$28 round trip per adult and \$20.00 per child (ages 4-11). Reservations from the airport to the resort are not necessary in advance as shuttles operate 24 hours per day and leave every 15-20 minutes. Reservations from the hotel to the airport are required four hours prior to airline departure time. The World Center is the first stop from the airport.


